Comments from Public or Elected Officials.

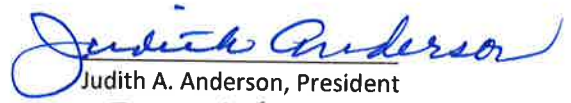
Commissioner Jon Marvel addressed the idea of possible limits to certain roads for a temporary time period during the colder months. This would help eliminate some damage to the roads. Rob McMullen would like a copy of the map to give to dispatchers so they may try to avoid this area when regular patrols. This would not prohibit emergency vehicles from accessing the roads.

Jeremy Snowden informed the Commissioners about the new web design that will launch next year. They are still working on the secondary pages and there will not be a contact phone number on the main page anymore. They will direct that towards each department. Commissioner Jon Marvel asked about the fake invoice emails (spam) that were being sent out yesterday as well as Jeremy's email he sent out. Jeremy stated that spam emails are filtered out as much as they can be but they cannot eliminate all. Also they have added wifi to the court house and that has added an additional 200-300 users connected to the public wifi access. People are accessing the internet more than ever and they are seeing a 200 % increase which is taking up most of the bandwidth the county uses. To add an additional one would cost \$1,200 per month. They are asking people to limit their non-work related usage and if that does not work with the usage amounts they will block certain sites from being accessed if need be. Another point that has taken up a lot of usage is the Odyssey training at the Sheriff's department. There are 30 computers that are all connected. This was an unexpected amount of usage from what was originally suspected.

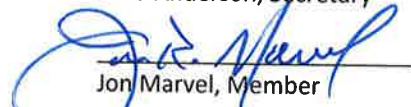
