Pledge of Allegiance

President Mike Morris called the meeting to order and turned it over to President Pro Tem David Thompson to conduct. Mr. Thompson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

A copy of the email from each individual is attached to these minutes in its entirety. Regarding a specific portion of the email from Andre Kummerow stating: "There was certainly a great deal of controversy when this tax was passed and 4 of you were present and supported the tax when it was passed by the council." Councilman Mann addressed this statement as follows: "In that particular email, I believe it says 'four members present and supported the tax'. Four members were present. Three supported the tax, one did not." An extensive discussion took place among the Council members.

Communications from elected officials of the County

Reports from select committees

There were none.

Old Business Encumbrances. An updated list of encumbrances was provided by the Auditor's Office to show the changes that had been made since the review in last month's meeting along with some additional revisions that were discovered since that time. Aaron Loudermilk moved to approve the amended encumbrances as presented. Lisa Spence-Bunnett seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, the motion passed unanimously with a 7-0 vote.

New Business Ordinances relating to appropriations.

a. ***Budget Adjustment Committee.***

i. Backup battery UPS system in 911; ROC 19. This matter was sent from Committee to full Council with a favorable recommendation. Vickie Oster with E911 was present to give information on this request. The current system is approximately 20 years old and is at end of life. Ms. Oster got quotes and budgeted for this project last year, however, when trying to implement the purchase this year, it was learned that the quote did not include installation and will require additional funds to be able to finalize the purchase. Ms. Oster then obtained 2 additional quotes and is now requesting the additional funds to complete the purchase. She currently has \$26,266.00 budgeted for this purchase. There is also \$3,570.00 budgeted for maintenance fees. When this matter came before the Budget Adjustment Committee, the Committee asked Ms. Oster to obtain some additional maintenance information on one of the quotes. In order to keep this project moving in a timely fashion, the larger of the two quotes was what was initially asked to be appropriated. When asked which quote she preferred, her response was that she would like to stay with the local vendor, NRK, Inc., which actually turns out to be less than the amount requested. If NRK is selected, she will need an additional \$36,003.00 to be able to complete the project. Aaron Loudermilk made a motion to amend Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2020-99 to show the amount appropriated for new equipment to be \$28,293.00 and add a 39200 service agreement line for \$7,710.00 for a total amount of \$36,003.00. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, by a vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously amended.

James R. Mann II then made a motion to approve Amended Additional Appropriation Ordinance 2020-09. The motion was seconded by Lisa Spence-Bunnett. Upon a roll call vote, by a vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

b. ***Annual Budget Committee.***

i. Creation of Non-Reverting Fund; ROC 22. This request was withdrawn by Norm Loudermilk, Executive Director of the Juvenile Justice Center.

ii. Annual tax abatement compliance review; ROC 23. We received five annual compliance forms and the Committee moved all of them forward to full Council as substantially compliant. Those filing were: Midwest Investments, LLC; D&D Automation Incorporation; Advics Manufacturing Indiana, LLC; Casey's Marketing Company; and Steel Dynamics Heartland, LLC. Mike Morris made a motion to approve these filings as substantially compliant. Aaron Loudermilk seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, by a vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

Honorary Resolutions

There were none.

First reading by summary reference of proposed ordinances and resolutions

President Mike Morris assigned the Request of Council to Committee for further review as follows:

Personnel Committee

Request of Council 20-024 – Vigo Circ/Sup Court – Adjust pay rate for court reporter

James R. Mann II announced that he would be resigning from the Annual Budget Committee because it was his belief that the 2021 budget should be crafted by members who will be in county government for the 2021 year. He expressed his gratitude to the Council for the opportunity to chair that committee for the six months of this year.

Appointments

There were none.

Kylissa Miller announced that earlier Mr. Effner had recommended that it be stated during the meeting that any comments from the public could still be submitted to county.council@vigocounty.in.gov so that they will be distributed to the Council members. This is all in compliance with the meeting structure due to COVID 19.

Councilman Morris also added that he would take over the duties of Mr. Mann on the Annual Budget Committee for the time being. Mr. Mann stated that just to be clear, he was not resigning from the Council, just the Committee.

The next meeting will be on August 11, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.

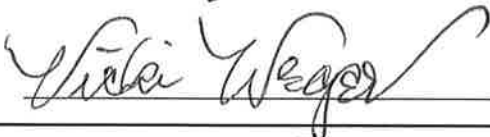

Dear Vigo County Council,

My name is Tina Simons. I am writing this email in place of being in person at your meeting to beg you to prioritize investing our tax dollars directly in the people of our county. We need it desperately.

On March 25 of this year, I founded Vigo County Mutual Aid. I started this group to create a central place where our residents could ask for and offer support to each other during the COVID-19 crisis. I foresaw there being a great need here as people lost their jobs and income. Since then, over 200 people have requested help by completing a form. Approximately 90% of the requests for help have been related to immediate food needs. I've spoken to every single one of them, and their stories are heartbreaking. I have talked to countless families who have not eaten for multiple days. I have cried with mothers who do not have food for their children's dinner that same night. I have worked with families who do not have a stove or microwave to cook the food they receive from Catholic Charities. Many people have expressed shame and guilt for having to ask for help, and almost every person has said they are scared and don't know what to do next. I wish I could tell them that it is going to be okay, that their babies will be fed and safe, that they're community is with them. I can't honestly tell them this. It's not okay, their babies are not safe, and their community is failing them.

According to the US Census Bureau 2018 data, the rate of poverty in Terre Haute is 25.6 percent. That is 1/4 of our residents. The national average is 11.8 percent. Our residents experience substantially higher rates of poverty than the rest of the nation. We are doing something wrong. While I don't have access to data on how poverty or food insecurity has increased this year due to the pandemic, I guarantee it is worse than ever. I am seeing the terrible consequences every day in Vigo County Mutual Aid. What are we doing about this? I will continue to fight for people's basic needs to be met through VCMA. But as a Master of Social Work student, I am learning that individual advocacy must be met by legislative action in order to be effective. We NEED our local government to support the wellness of our community through legislation and funds. It is the only way our county can effectively aid those who are most vulnerable here.

In addition to poverty, we must also act to address racism and disproportionality in the treatment of our Black community members (if you have not already done so, PLEASE take time to watch the videos of the Community Talk Back event that took place last Thursday, where our Black brothers and sisters shared their experiences of racism in this county - they can be found on the Wabash Valley in Solidarity Facebook page). We must act to enhance mental health and create resources for individuals facing addiction and trauma. Poverty, racism, mental health, and addiction are SYSTEMIC issues that require systemic solutions. There is only so much individuals and agencies can do to address these; we absolutely need legislative action and funding to address the broken systems we have here. It is the only way we will see systemic change that is so needed in our county.

Please be the change we need by funding programs that will contribute to growth, not oppression. Please spend our tax dollars like our residents' lives depend on it - because they do. Please invest in eliminating oppression in our county not by contributing to the currently broken systems, but by investing in the wellness of our most vulnerable people - those in poverty, those who experience the consequences of racism every single day, and those who face mental health impacts. This is how we change Vigo County for the better.

The following is intended for the public comment portion of the 6-9-20 County Council meeting.

The increase in the local income tax (LIT) which was passed by the county council two years ago has steadily been accumulating funds. It has been reported that there will be a \$28 million surplus over the first 6 years it is collected and 2 of those 6 years have already passed. There was certainly a great deal of controversy when this tax was passed and 4 of you were present and supported the tax when it was passed by the council. Based on the analysis presented by Councilwoman Spence Bunnett, it appears that there is a significant portion of these taxes that are being collected without a specific plan for what to do with them. By the end of 2020 it appears that there will be \$4 million dollars sitting in the Public Safety portion of the LIT without any specific expenses. My question to you, and in particular to those of you who voted for this tax increase, can these funds be directed towards programs such as recovery, homelessness, or mental illness which will reduce incarceration rates, and do you specifically support the use of a significant portion of these funds for these purposes?

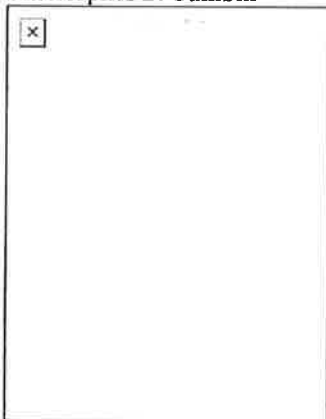

Pledge of Allegiance

Councilman James R. Mann II called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Calling of the Roll

Public comment

There were none.

Communications from elected officials, other officials, and agencies of the County

Norm Loudermilk, Executive Director of the Juvenile Justice Center, appeared and advised that he had asked that his request for creation of a non-reverting fund be withdrawn and removed from the agenda.

Requests of Council

- a. ***ROC 20-023, Annual Tax Abatement Compliance Review.*** This meeting is for the annual compliance review of existing tax abatements as explained by Council Administrator Kylissa Miller. Mr. Mann stated that they would be looking at Sections 3 and 4 of the form. Ms. Miller commented that with regard to Midwest Investments, LLC and D&D Automation, Inc., the abatements were granted in late 2019 and they have not yet been assessed. They went ahead and filed these compliance forms but technically, they are not eligible for the abatement until the assessments have been completed and are on file. Therefore, their numbers will mostly be zeros. Discussion ensued with regard to the numbers/compliance with the other three forms that had been submitted. Mr. Mann questioned whether we had a count on how many actual abatements there are. Ms. Miller responded that she did not know but there were more than this. The deadline for filing was May 15 and although she had not heard if the deadline had been extended or changed, she thought perhaps some of the companies might have been challenged to meet the deadline because of the pandemic. However, we have 45 days to act after the May 15 deadline. So, with there not being a July Council meeting scheduled at this time, if we don't get it done for the June meeting, it would be August before this was addressed. A fifth form filed by Steel Dynamics Heartland, LLC was just received in today's mail and added to the agenda just before today's meeting commenced. A brief discussion was then had regarding that form. Vicki Weger moved that having reviewed the Compliance with Statement of Benefits Improvements, we find that Midwest Investments, LLC Form CF-1/Real Property, D&D Automation, Inc. Form CF-1/PP, ADVICS Manufacturing Indiana, LLC Form CF-1/PP, Casey's Marketing Company Form CF-1/Real Property, and Steel Dynamics Heartland, LLC Form CF-1/PP to be in compliance with their agreement with the

County. The motion was seconded by Chris Switzer. Mr. Mann then stated that we are voting here this afternoon for the benefit of the full Council to learn that this Committee's review does find these five entities to be compliant with the agreement set forth in the previous year creation of their abatement. By a voice vote of 3-0, the motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment

With all the business being addressed, Chris Switzer moved that the meeting be adjourned. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. By a voice vote of 3-0, the meeting was adjourned at 4:05 p.m.

Council Administrator Kylissa Miller advised that she had not received any.

Communications from elected officials, other officials, and agencies of the County

Lisa Spence-Bunnett referred to conversations had during the last Budget Adjustment Committee and full Council meetings regarding encumbrances. She is going to put together a proposed procedure for how to handle encumbrances on an annual basis. Hopefully the end result will make the process easier on everyone and there will be a clearer understanding among everyone involved. Everyone agreed to move ahead along these lines and Councilwoman Spence-Bunnett will forward an email with this proposal to all involved to start the process.

Requests of Council

#20-019 E911 – Backup battery UPS System in 911.

Vicki Oster stated that she is requesting additional funds for the battery back-up system for E911. This is an uninterruptible power supply so that in the event power goes out, there will be a limited time to keep things running until the generator kicks in so they will never be completely without power. The old back-up is approximately 20 years old and is reaching its end of life. Vickie was made aware in October of 2019 that this was going to need to be replaced and she did get a quote for a replacement from the current company used now, Precise Power. Vickie did figure in the quoted amount of \$26,266.00 into this year's budget. However, when she called to set up the replacement time, Precise Power advised that the amount did not include installation which would increase the overall cost substantially. She did get two additional quotes, one from NRK and one from Ra-Comm. She would be happy with either one but she would be inclined to pick the lower quote. She is asking for an

additional appropriation to make up the difference between the quote decided upon and the amount she currently has in the budget (\$26,266.00) for this replacement. An in-depth discussion then took place. Questions were raised regarding any substantive differences between the two quotes (i.e. warranty information, maintenance, etc.). It was decided that Ms. Oster would follow up on warranty information, maintenance and battery costs from NRK and supply that information. Additional discussion ensued. Council Administrator Kylissa Miller and Auditor James Bramble suggested it might be wiser to advertise the amount of the high bid be appropriated. In the event the additional information provided by NRK proves to be less favorable than anticipated, the request for additional funding will be in place and the replacement can still be accomplished without having to repeat this process. If the lower bid is ultimately chosen, the additional amount to be appropriated can be amended. Lisa Spence-Bunnett made a motion to move ROC 20-019 to full Council favorably for an amount of \$44,250.00. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a voice vote, the motion passed unanimously to move to full Council with a favorable recommendation.
