Pledge of Allegiance

President Aaron Loudermilk called the meeting to order at 5:00.

Calling of the roll

Present: R. Todd Thacker, Travis Norris, Marie Theisz, Vicki Weger, Brenda Wilson, David Thompson, Aaron Loudermilk.

Correcting of the journal of the preceding meeting if needed

August 3, 2021 Sunshine Meeting

August 10, 2021 Regular Meeting

There were no corrections to the minutes of the August 3, 2021 Sunshine Meeting. David Thompson made a motion to approve the minutes of the Sunshine Meeting. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, the motion passed with a vote of 7-0.

There were no corrections to the minutes of the August 10, 2021 regular meeting. Travis Norris made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote, the motion passed with a vote of 7-0.

Public Comments

President Loudermilk asked if there were any comments regarding items NOT on the agenda. There were none. He then asked if there were any comments regarding the proposed tax abatement for Steel Dynamics. There were none.

Communications from elected officials, other officials or agencies of the County

Vicki Weger encouraged everyone at, or listening to the live stream, of the meeting to contact the Indiana Gaming Commission in support of the application of Greg Gibson and his efforts to have the casino here in Vigo County.

Reports from standing committee(s)

Todd Thacker gave an update on where the Annual Budget Committee is at on making a recommendation to the full Council for the 2022 annual budget. They anticipate finishing up very soon and get a copy to the other Council members as soon as possible after a recommendation is reached.

Ordinances relating to appropriations.

i. First Reading Binding Units 2022 Annual Budgets

Auditor James Bramble gave the First Reading of the Binding Units for 2022 Annual Budgets as follows: "Notice is hereby given to taxpayers of Vigo County Solid Waste Management District, Terre Haute International Airport Authority, Honey Creek Fire Protection District, New Goshen Fire Protection District, Lost Creek Fire Protection District, Prairieton Fire Protection District, Riley Fire Protection District, Sugar Creek Township Fire District, all of Vigo County, Indiana, that the proper officers will conduct a public hearing on the year 2022 budget. Following this meeting, any ten or more taxpayers may object to a budget, tax rate, or tax levy by filing an objection petition with the proper officers of the Vigo County Council not more than seven days after the hearing. The objection petition must identify the provisions of the budget, tax rate, or tax levy to which taxpayers object. If a petition is filed, the Vigo County Council shall adopt with the budget a finding concerning the objections in the petition and testimony presented. Following the aforementioned hearing, the proper officers of the Vigo County Council will meet to adopt the following budgets. The public hearing date is Tuesday, September 14, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. at the County Council Chambers, Terre Haute, Indiana and the adoption meeting is Tuesday, October 12, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. at the County Council Chambers, 127 Oak Street, Terre Haute, Indiana."

ii. First reading Capital Improvement Board 2022 Annual Budget

Auditor James Bramble gave the First Reading of the Vigo County Capital Improvement Board. Their proposed 2022 Annual Budget shows total receipts of \$5,223,272 and expenses of the same amount for next year. The beginning cash balance is \$1,546,994 and the ending cash balance on 12/31/22 is \$1,546,994.

iii. Resolution 2021-14, Confirmatory Resolution Setting Forth Final Action In Determining That The Qualifications For an Economic Revitalization Area Have Been Met, Approving Real and Personal Property Tax Abatements and Confirming Resolution No. 2021-11

This has been fully discussed at prior Council meetings. It was determined that there were no further questions by Council. Councilman Todd Thacker reiterated prior comments that he would like to see some sort of format sheet created for the purpose of tax abatements and how to rank them in the future for consistency. Councilwoman Theisz agreed and noted that she would be happy to assist in creation of such a format at some point. There being no further comments, Brenda Wilson made a motion to approve Resolution 2021-14. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

iv. Additional Appropriation 2021-37; ROC 2021-37: Honey Creek Fire Protection District

This was discussed at the Sunshine Meeting last week. This is an additional appropriation for debt service in the amount of \$4,606.02. Todd Thacker noted that Appropriations needed to be made in whole dollars and this appropriation would need to be amended to \$4,606.00. Todd Thacker made a motion to amend Additional Appropriation 2021-37 from \$4,606.02 to \$4,606.00. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved. Todd Thacker then

made a motion to approve Amended Additional Appropriation 2021-37 in the amount of \$4,606. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Joe Shackelford of the Honey Creek Fire Protection District then noted that they needed \$4,707 due to the fact that their bank loan payment line has one penny in it and they would need to go to the next dollar above in order to have enough funds to pay the loan payment. There was a discussion among the Council and it was noted that with the amount advertised for the appropriation being \$4,606.02, the most that could be appropriated is \$4,606.00. A solution to the problem was then discussed. It was determined that the amount of \$4,606 should be appropriated and a solution could be decided later. A motion to approve was currently on the floor. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

**v. Resolution of Reallocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-12;
ROC 2021-038: Building Inspection**

Terry Bays, Building Inspector, was present to answer any questions Council might have on this transfer from Payroll Salaries to Code Enforcement and Gasoline. Mr. Thacker asked about the need to do this. Mr. Bays explained that part time help had been used in previous years but those positions are hard to fill and they had been unable to hire anyone for them. No applications were received. Therefore, they had to contract the mowing out. So, in order to pay for the independent mowing contractors, they needed to use the monies set aside for the part-time position to Code Enforcement and Gasoline. Mr. Bays did note that grass liens are put on the properties that are mowed and the county does get reimbursed for some of them. There was some additional discussion. Brenda Wilson made a motion to approve Resolution of Reallocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-12. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

**vi. Additional Appropriation 2021-21; ROC 2021-039: Vigo
County Solid Waste Management District**

This matter was discussed at the Sunshine Meeting in depth. Upon determination that there were no further questions or comments from Council, Todd Thacker made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation 2021-21. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

**vii. Resolution of Reallocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-13;
ROC 2021-40: Vigo County Veterans Assistance Office**

Tim Cunningham of Veterans Assistance was present to answer any questions about this request. With no questions or comments from the Council, Vicki Weger made a motion to approve Resolution of Reallocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-13. David Thompson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

**viii. Additional Appropriation 2021-22; ROC 2021-42: Vigo
County Commissioners**

There have been multiple meetings and discussions regarding this topic. The three Commissioners and HR Director Kara Wright were present for any questions. Marie Theisz asked if this appropriation was just for use for the services in general or if it was

to be used for a specific company's services. President Loudermilk noted that the request was specific for the appropriation to be used for Baker Tilly. Todd Thacker asked for clarification as to whether, by approving this request, it would mean that the Commissioners would be selecting the service and signing the contract or if the Council would be making the selection and signing the contract. President Loudermilk said that if it is approved as presented, it would be between the Commissioners and Baker Tilly. There was a lengthy, in-depth discussion. Brenda Wilson made a motion to deny Additional Appropriation 2021-22 based on the fact that it is unclear. David Thompson seconded the motion. There was discussion among the Council regarding the meaning of an aye or nay vote. If an aye vote is cast, it is to deny the appropriation. Before a vote was taken, there was additional in-depth discussion and comments from Commissioners and Councilpersons. Travis Norris suggested possibly getting a third bid from a different company offering the same services. Vigo County Clerk Brad Newman also made a plea on behalf of the employees of Vigo County that emphasis needed to be placed on the employees and helping them rather than bickering. He also noted that his prior experience with Waggoner, Irwin & Scheele had been very unsatisfactory. He said that he and many other department heads had been approached by many employees expressing their dissatisfaction with the prior results of Waggoner Irwin & Scheele and wanting to know why they were even being considered again. He also felt that department heads should be part of the process. After some additional comments, President Loudermilk noted that there seemed to be a general assumption that the Council favored the hiring of Waggoner Irwin & Scheele. He stated that was not necessarily the case and that it was his feeling that the Council still had some additional concerns that needed to be sorted out. It was his personal feeling that the work to be contracted to an independent service for this review should not be conducted by our HR Department because it would put too much pressure on one person. He reiterated that it was the ultimate concern of the Council that the employees be treated fairly. Discussion continued. With a motion currently on the floor to deny Additional Appropriation 2021-22, the voting was as follows: Todd Thacker – nay; Travis Norris – aye; Marie Theisz – nay; Vicki Weger – nay; Brenda Wilson – aye; David Thompson – aye; Aaron Loudermilk – aye. With a vote of 4-3, the additional appropriation was denied.

- ix. Additional Appropriation 2021-23; ROC 2021-42: Vigo County Health Department**
- x. Additional Appropriation 2021-24; ROC 2021-42: LIT/PSAP**
- xi. Resolution of Reallocation of Existing Appropriation 2021-15; ROC 2021-42: County Council/Commissioners**

These three appropriations are all part of the same request and were discussed as one item at the Sunshine Meeting. These additional appropriations and resolution of reallocation were to pay for shortfalls in the unemployment budgets of the three departments. Notice had been received earlier today that the State is giving a credit that will be paid for by the CARES Act against unemployment debt and the entire amounts requested may not actually be needed but Auditor James Bramble asked that it be approved so that in the event that the entire amounts would be needed, it would be there to pay. This was briefly discussed. If the entire appropriation is not used, it will revert back to the general fund at the end of the year. Todd Thacker made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation

2021-23. Vicki Weger seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved. David Thompson made a motion to approve Additional Appropriation 2021-24. Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved. Travis Norris made a motion to approve Resolution of Reallocation 2021-15. Brenda Wilson seconded the motion. Upon a roll call vote of 7-0, the motion was unanimously approved.

CONFIRMATORY RESOLUTION NO. 2021-14

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF VIGO COUNTY, INDIANA SETTING FORTH FINAL ACTION IN DETERMINING THAT THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR AN ECONOMIC REVITLIZATION AREA HAVE BEEN MET, APPROVING REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY ABATEMENTS AND CONFIRMING RESOLUTION NO. 2021-11

WHEREAS, pursuant to Indiana Code § 6-1.1-12.1-1, *et. seq.* (the “Act”), the Vigo County Council (the “Council”) previously considered and adopted Resolution No. 2021-11, a declaratory resolution (the “Declaratory Resolution”) of the Council declaring an area within Vigo County, Indiana commonly identified as 455 W. Industrial Drive, Terre Haute, Indiana 47802 (the “Property”) as an Economic Revitalization Area (“ERA”) for purposes of real and personal property tax abatements; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 6-1.1-12.1-2.5, the Council has published notice (“Notice”) of the adoption and substance of the Declaratory Resolution and the date on which the Council would hold a public hearing (the “Public Hearing”) to receive and hear remonstrance and objection on the Declaratory Resolution and the actions contemplated therein, as required under Indiana law; and

WHEREAS, the Council in accordance with the Act has caused to be filed a copy of the Notice and the Declaratory Resolution with the Vigo County Assessor and the officers of each taxing unit which is authorized to fix budgets, tax rates, and tax levies under Indiana Code § 6-1.1-17-5 in the ERA at least ten (10) days prior to the date hereof;

WHEREAS, on the date hereof, the Council conducted the Public Hearing, whereby all persons and organizations wishing to express their views were heard and consideration was given to any such views and the Council has considered any remonstrance or objection regarding the Declaratory Resolution and contemplated real and personal tax abatements; and

WHEREAS, the Council has received and examined the Petition for Tax Abatement (the “Petition”) together with the Statements of Benefits (collectively, the “SB-1/RP, and SB-1/PP”), each as filed by Steel Dynamics Heartland, LLC (the “Petitioner”), on forms prescribed by the State of Indiana, along with proper applications and supporting materials for ERA designation, and has heard all appropriate evidence concerning the proposed project as described in the Petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS FOUND, DETERMINED, AND RESOLVED BY THE VIGO COUNTY COUNCIL THAT:

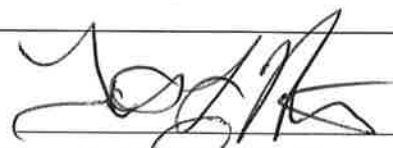
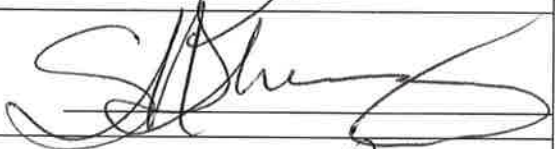
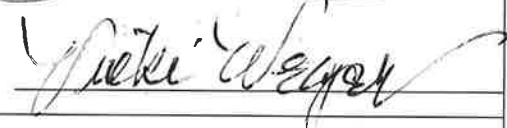
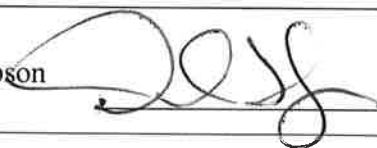
1. The Property and proposed Project is located in the ERA which is hereby deemed and confirmed as an Economic Revitalization Area pursuant to the Act.
2. The Petitioner’s \$34,650,000 estimate of the costs and value of the real property redevelopment of the Property and Project together with an approximate estimate of

\$196,350,000 investment in new manufacturing equipment are reasonable for Projects of the nature described in the Petition.

3. The Petitioner's estimate of approximately 226 current full-time jobs which will be retained and the approximately 84 new full-time jobs which will be created can reasonably be expected to result from Petitioner's investment and implementation of the Project.
4. The Petitioner's estimates of annual salaries of those individuals who will be employed or whose employment will be retained can reasonably be expected to result from Petitioner's investment and implementation of the Project.
5. The Personal Property to be acquired in support of the Project constitutes new manufacturing equipment which will be placed into service within the ERA designated hereby and which otherwise meets all eligibility requirements for personal property abatement under the Act.
6. The totality of the benefits expected to arise from the Project is sufficient to justify a 10-year, 100% abatement of real property and personal property (the "Abatements"), as authorized by the Act, and such deductions should be and are hereby allowed.
7. All qualifications for establishing an ERA have been met, and after legally required public notice and after public hearing pursuant to such notice, the Council hereby takes "final action", as defined in Ind. Code § 6-1.1-12.1-2.5, on the date hereof, and hereby approves the Petition, SB-1/RP, and SB-1/PP.
8. Resolution 2021-11 is in all respects confirmed and approved, the ERA is hereby designated, and the Abatements are hereby approved in all respects.
9. Upon the adoption of this Resolution, the Council shall cause a certified copy of this Resolution, including a description of the previously described location and attached map, to be filed with the Vigo County Assessor, County Auditor, and/or such other Vigo County government officials as shall be necessary to make the Petitioner eligible to file for real and personal property tax abatements as to the real and personal property contemplated by the SB-1/RP, and SB-1/PP, heretofore reviewed and approved by the Declaratory Resolution and ratified and confirmed by this Resolution.
