- I. **Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance:** Dr. Amber Cadick, VCBH President called the meeting to order, led the pledge of allegiance, and turned the floor over to Dr. Jennifer Todd. Dr. Todd shared this would be her last board of health meeting because she is moving out of state. She talked about the successes and dedication she observed while on the board of health. She stated she appreciated the opportunity to serve.
- II. **Roll Call:** Robbin Poore, Bookkeeper
- III. **Minutes to the VCBH Meeting of July 16, 2025:** **ACTION ITEM:** Motion to accept the July board minutes made by Jimmy McKanna, 2nd made by Marc Keilman. All board members present approved.
- IV. **Financial Report:** Robbin Poore, Bookkeeper, shared she has changed the visual layout for the financial chart of accounts. She stated the department is in the process of purchasing end of the year needs.
- V. **Health Officer's Communications:** Darren Brucken, MD was absent due to travel.
- VI. **Administrator's Communications:** Joni Wise reported she participated as a 4-H judge at the Vigo County Fair, continues to participate on the INSACCHO state board and HFI Core Leadership team, attends quarterly meetings regarding the jail overcrowding, working with Mayor's office on warming shelter coordination and usage of the Opioid Settlement Fund.

VII. New Business

2026 VC Board of Health meetings: January 21, April 15, July 15 & October 21. All meetings are at 5:00 pm. The January and July meetings are in the Council Chambers. The April and October meetings are in the VC Commissioner's conference room due to early voting. **ACTION ITEM** Motion to accept the 2026 meeting dates made by Jimmy McKanna, 2nd made by Dr. Micah Thompson. All board members present approved.

A. **Other:** None

VIII. Old Business

A. **VC Council 2026 proposed budget status update:** Joni Wise, Administrator reported the 2026 proposed budget passed with minor changes. Dr. Cadick asked about salary increases for county employees. Joni shared Indiana municipalities and other tax funded entities are being cautious due to not knowing the full impact of SEA 1. The council has diligently worked hard towards increasing county employee salaries but want to make sure the amount is sustainable in the future.

B. **Standards for Public Health Swimming Pool Facility Update:** Amanda Puller shared the ordinance passed the vote by the VC Commissioner's and our website has been updated to reflect the changes.

C. **Amended Board of Health Fee Collection Ordinance Update:** Amanda Puller shared the ordinance passed the vote by the VC Commissioner's and our website has been updated to reflect the changes.

D. **Other:** None

IX. Division Updates:

A. **Environmental:** Amanda Puller, Supervisor reported the environmental health division staff attended the fall Indiana Environmental Health Conference in southeastern Indiana. There has been an uptick in lead cases, staff are doing 2 risk assessments each week. The EH staff are coming off their busy season.

B. **Social Services:** Molly Collett the social service division staff, has been working to enhance data collection, added to their report. The division continues to collaborate and build relationships. She also attends the quarterly meeting regarding the jail overcrowding with the VC Sheriff, VC Jail Commander and Matron, Chief Deputy Prosecutor, Community Corrections Administrator, Judges, Public Defender's Office, and jail attorney. Jimmy McKanna thanked the division for the additional data. Jeremy Baker, In-Take Coordinator, discussed the resource guide created for the community, which the jail approved. He wanted everyone to have access to it, so we added a printable version on our website. He shared when he started working in the position it was difficult because the jail population were not used to being asked what they needed. After trust and word of mouth spread his work is "rolling." He also talked about the challenges individuals face after release from jail. Food insecurity, housing, clothing, work, and transportation are some of the greatest needs. Dr. Cadick shared 40% of wellness is based on social determinants of health and Jeremy is helping to improve this. Dr. Todd discussed the goal is to keep people from returning to jail. She inquired if staff knew the number of individuals rearrested that asked for help again. The impact on the jail population is getting people connected to resources. Jeremy shared if it is a mental health need, he hooks them up with one of LCSW with the courts for help.

- C. Clinic: Robin Maurer, Supervisor proudly shared our Back-to-School Vaccine "Bash" was a success! We recently received our vaccine completion rates which are excellent. This also includes the timeliness of entering vaccines into the CHIRP database. She explained CHIRP is a centralized database which includes children and adult vaccine records. Staff went to Head Start and to do tb tests for employees, along with lead and hemoglobin tests for the children.
- D. Health Education/Media Coordination: Shelby Jackson talked about the Safe Sleep Trailer and its updated usage. We have identified ways to ensure safety when participants are in the trailer, such as steps and temperature control. We have 45 Narcan kits on site, non-injectable epinephrine and 30 wound care kits. 22 individuals have completed the ServSafe program facilitated by Shelby and Amanda Baker. Marc Keilman saw in Shelby's report where she did a presentation at Silver Birch, which is a long-term care facility. Shelby shared she does presentations upon request.
- E. Vector Control: Mike Grayless, Supervisor reported all rabie submissions to the state lab were negative. This last quarter the division filled four 53' semi-trailers with discarded tires, which are a primary breeding ground for West Nile Virus. 104 pools (samples) of mosquitos were submitted to the state lab with 18 positive pools during the last quarter. Culex mosquitoes love stagnant water to lay eggs. Mike proceeded to give a comparative analysis between Indiana and Illinois for positive pools, human cases, and deaths. Dr. Lim inquired if there is a vaccine to prevent West Nile Virus. Dr. Thompson said there is not one. Mike also explained that the smaller counties do not have Vector Control programs, so IDOH will send their employees to conduct surveillance. As soon as a positive pool occurs, surveillance stops and public education kicks in. Dr. Lim inquired if we increase fogging when we find WNV in a particular area of the county, with the answer being "yes." Dr. Lim asked questions regarding the transmission of West Nile Virus, and Mike explained the process. Joni Wise added our mosquito control program is three pronged: education, surveillance, and prevention.
- F. Vital Records: Loretta Little, Supervisor was absent, so Robbin Poore presented the report. Vital Records is not moving forward at this time in asking the board to consider charging out of county birth and death certificate rates at the fee established in the county from which the record originally generated. We continue to provide birth certificates for those that are homeless or seeking housing in shelter. Due to the increasing number of free certificates being issued, different solutions are being considered regarding how to address this because the current rate is not financially sustainable. Marc inquired about drug related deaths and how they compare to last year. Dr. Cadick discussed the Indiana overdose website and pointed out our numbers are low compared to the rest of the state. Joni Wise shared Coroner Travis Norris would like to submit a request for funding proposal for an IDOH Trauma and Injury Prevention grant. Shelby Jackson is going to assist with the focus on safe sleep by enhancing the educational use of our interactive Safe Sleep trailer.
- X. **Citizens Input** Joni Wise stated the federal government shutting down has not affected our health department.

In October we continued to offer the Flu vaccine for our full time employees. We have given a total of 96 vaccinations for the County employees so far. We do have plenty more to offer!

The clinic staff along with our other departments have interned two St Mary of the Woods students this quarter. They were very interested in Public Health and learned A LOT!! Robin Maurer had a meeting with Amanda O'Brien an instructor from St Mary's about their internship program on October 24th. We will be taking on more students to learn about Public Health in the future.

On October 22nd the Clinic switched our billing process to be through Vaxcare for all insurances. This process was a success and the staff has adopted the new procedure with ease.

We hired a new front office staff member, her name is Hope Taylor. Hope was hired October 23rd and started with us on November 10th.

On October 28th Deb Sweeting, Coni Thomas, Libby O'Pell and Robin Maurer had a luncheon with GSK's pharmaceuticals rep Gregg Morris. During this time, we discussed the importance of vaccinations for all ages and the vaccination schedules.

October 29th Amy Krupa the District 7 Field Epidemiologist from the IDOH was at the clinic to do follow up training with all clinic staff.

November was busy with getting the school aged children up to date on their vaccinations due to the exclusion letters going out.

Robin Maurer and Deb Sweeting went into the Vigo County Jail to offer Flu vaccines for the staff on December 2nd.

Dolly Moss our employee of 35 years retired on December 5th along with Teresa Bechtel who retired also on December 17th. Both will be missed!!

December 10th Robin Maurer, Deb Sweeting, Coni Thomas and Libby O’Pell attended virtual training with the IDOH on Hepatitis B&C. This included Hepatitis C services. We will continue training sessions in March, June, September and December.

We will continue TB skin testing/reading, vaccine administration including patient/parent education on immunization, inventory/ordering vaccines, scheduling appointments and case management. Continue to provide a room for Court ordered DNA testing through Lab Corp. on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month. Dr. Catherine Brown MD offers physicals and well child checkups on Friday mornings by appointment.

Molly Collett–Social Services Division Supervisor

Jail Programing

- Intake Coordinator-Focusing on initial screening, preparing, support and collaborates with everyone as they leave the jail and into the first 30 days on reentry. Oversee all the resources, and referrals for individuals leaving the Vigo County Jail.

This position is evolving, and I am looking forward to its growth.

- MRT (in the jail and community corrections)
 - Moral Reconation Therapy: MRT promotes moral reasoning, better decision-making, and improvement of behavior. It is based on the idea that risky and criminal behavior stems from faulty thinking patterns, such as a lack of empathy, distorted perceptions of right and wrong, and impulsivity.
- Seeking Safety- Treatment for PTSD and Substance Abuse
- Peer Coaching: A peer recovery coach is a non-clinical support person who brings valuable lived experience with addiction and recovery, combined with specialized training and supervision, to effectively provide non-clinical recovery support to individuals seeking recovery.
- The Change Program-Interactive Journaling is an evidence-based practice for motivating and guiding individuals toward positive life change. It is goal directed, client-centered and helps participants modify behavior while progressing through the stages of change, precontemplation, contemplation, preparation action and maintenance. (Limited)

To provide more context on The Change Companies, they partner with many justice-involved agencies like the Indiana Dept. of Corrections and Allen County Jail since they are the publishers of risk-need-responsive Interactive Journals. The journals are meant to help facilitators guide their program participants toward positive behavior change (in this case: recidivism reduction and working toward sustainable employment) using evidence-based practices like Motivational Interviewing, CBT, and Expressive Writing.
