AGENDA

- I. **Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance:** Amber Cadick, PhD, Board President called the meeting to order, led the pledge of allegiance, and introduced new board member, Alpa Patel. Ms. Patel is an attorney, a past Vigo County School Board Trustee for twelve years, a member of the local Ivy Tech board, Vigo County Education Foundation, United Way Success by Six and a community advocate.
- I. **Roll Call:** Robbin Poore
- II. **Minutes to the VCBH Meeting on October 15, 2025: ACTION ITEM:** Motion to accept the October board minutes made by Jimmy McKanna, 2nd made by Jeff Depasse. All board members present approved.
- III. **Financial Report:** Robbin Poore, Bookkeeper Jimmy McKanna inquired if the beginning balances for 2026 were similar than last year's. The General Health Fund balance is usually the same as the previous year, but other funds do not have a steady stream of revenue, so the beginning balance is usually different from the previous year. The VC Council approves all budgets.
- IV. **Health Officer Report & Communications:** Dr. Brucken welcomed Alpa Patel to the Vigo County Board of Health. He highlighted the visit in early December by Indiana State Health Commissioner Dr. Weaver and her team. Dr. Weaver was complimentary of the work done by the Vigo County Health Department. Respiratory influenza cases have stabilized in the last two weeks and are slightly on the downtick. Mortality, especially among pediatrics, is up. Dr. Cadick inquired about the high number of overdoses from prescription medications and stimulants. Both are not opioids therefore Narcan is ineffective. The overdoses did not result in death, so the specifics of the overdoses are unknown.

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- V. **Administrator Report & Communications:** Joni Wise shared an overview of Dr. Weaver's visit from early December. All our HFI funded partners were there to highlight which core services they are focusing on and the strategies used. Joni relayed the department will host an IU School of Medicine student for a month-long rotation in February. The next couple of months will be challenging due to modifying the 2024-25-26 HFI budgets for the state to include carry-over requests and budget amendments. Also, the 2024-25 HFI financial expense reports are due during this quarter.
- VI. **New Business**
- A. Election of Vigo County Board Chairperson and Vice President
IC 16-20-2-4 Election of Chairman Sec. 14: At the first meeting of a local board of health each year, the members shall elect a chairman: **ACTION ITEM** Jeff Depass made the motion to nominate Dr. Amber Cadick for board president again, 2nd made by Dr. Lim. All in attendance approved. Jimmy McKanna made the motion to nominate Marc Keilman vice-president, 2nd made by Dr. Thompson. All in attendance approved.
- B. Other: None
- VII. **Old Business**
- A. **2026 Approved General Health Fund Update:** Joni Wise reported the Vigo County Council approved our 2026 General Health Fund budget without any cuts.
- VIII. **Programming Updates**
- A. Vital Statistics: Loretta Little introduced the new vitals registrar, Libby Knight. We had two past interns return for Christmas break and assist with data entry of old records. Local funeral homes are purchasing out of county death certificates with brings in additional revenue for our department. Dr. Cadick discussed the overdoses that did not lead to death. The overdose incidents are in the state program ESSENCE. Alpa Patel asked about the funeral homes purchasing out of county death certificates so Loretta Little informed her about the state database, DRIVE, which allows any county to produce a death certificate even if the death did not occur in that county.
- B. Vector Control: Mike Grayless shared this is the down time for Vector Control to focus on equipment and the maintenance of 22 vehicles. Species were shipped to the state lab to test for rabies, and all were negative. So far, the staff has picked up 81 dead deer's and no "critters", the word used to describe a deceased animal that is unidentifiable.
- C. Nursing: Robin Maurer said the clinic continues to vaccinate children. Also, case management for reportable diseases is a full-time task for staff members. We had two retirements in December. Dolly Moss and Teresa Bechtel retired after years of exceptional service. Robin introduced Hope Taylor as the new hire. She brings a plethora of clinic management skills to the division. Alpa Patel inquired if our vaccination rates are down based on the new federal recommendations. The answer is no, because parents and guardians have already done their research and will either vaccinate or not. The school corporation sent out exclusion letters for children who are not up to date on their vaccines, so the clinic was super busy giving shots last quarter. The clinic has also given more RSV vaccines than in the past.

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- D. Environmental:** Amanda Puller discussed the environmental health specialist's workload has been consistent over the last few months. IDOH puts out a training calendar, so staff have been ramping up on training. Started the year off by permitting 677 food establishments permits, 22 body art establishment permits, and 52 regular body artist permits, and 8 temporary artist licenses issued. Pools are permitted in April. Jimmy McKanna asked if the division was considering a food establishment grading system like other counties. Mandy has been doing research and looking at the best ways to establish a grading system. The purpose of the grading system is to provide quick, easily understood safety information to consumers. Marc inquired if there is a way to see how effective our food program does compared to other counties. There are variables like population, number of licensed food establishments and number of inspectors. The number one goal of the program is to lessen or stop foodborne illnesses. One could look at the population size and the number of foodborne illnesses to assess effectiveness of program, but this still would not account for foodborne illnesses from food prepared at home.
- E. Social Services:** Molly Collett highlighted the data from her division in the board packet. Seeking Safety is a 6-month program and while the percentages sometimes look low, many times the inmate is transferred to DOC or residential treatment before completing the program. There are factors that affect our completion rates for programming. Molly Collett and Larry Aynes will present at the NAMI Summit in March. NAMI stands for National Alliance Mental Illness. Molly reintroduced graduates from the program so they could give an update on their progress. Both spoke on the impact the jail programming has had to help them live healthier productive lives. Molly is also involved in a civic engagement series with other leaders in our region.
- F. Health Education:** Shelby Jackson shared the installment topics placed in the restrooms in the VC Government Annex. She reported the number of NARCAN doses in stock. The American Health Association has updated guidelines. Choking back slaps between the shoulders is acceptable for adults and kids. Infant CPR two finger method is no longer approved because most people cannot reach the appropriate depth of the chest with two fingers. A person can still use two thumbs with their hands wrapped around the chest. ServSafe dates were for 2026. INSACCHO was selected to be part of a cohort for Region 5 Local Public Health Leadership Institute through the University of Michigan. This consists of 36 members from Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Michigan, and Wisconsin. Shelby will be part of this group. The group meets weekly and sometimes bi-weekly to discuss different leadership initiatives and goals for public health.

On March 27th Amy Krupa (our field epidemiologist) came down from the IDOH to do NBS training with our new nurse Deborah. NBS is a NEDSS Based System through the IDOH.

The Clinic is collaborating with Headstart again. In April our clinic staff along with the lead case manager will go and do Lead Testing for the Headstart program.

The Clinic switched our billing process to be through Vaxcare for all insurances back in October. This process is a success and has not had many issues.

We will continue TB skin testing/reading, vaccine administration including patient/parent education on immunization, inventory/ordering vaccines, scheduling appointments and case management. Continue to provide a room for Court ordered DNA testing through Lab Corp. on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month. Dr. Catherine Brown MD offers physicals and well child checkups on Friday mornings by appointment.

Jail Programing

- Intake Coordinator-Focusing on initial screening, preparing, support and collaborates with everyone as they leave the jail and into the first 30 days on reentry. Oversee all the resources, and referrals for individuals leaving the Vigo County Jail.
This position is evolving, and I am looking forward to its growth.

- MRT (in the jail and community corrections)
-Moral Reconation Therapy: MRT promotes moral reasoning, better decision-making, and improvement of behavior. It is based on the idea that risky and criminal behavior stems from faulty thinking patterns, such as a lack of empathy, distorted perceptions of right and wrong, and impulsivity.
- Seeking Safety- Treatment for PTSD and Substance Abuse

- Peer Coaching: A peer recovery coach is a non-clinical support person who brings valuable lived experience with addiction and recovery, combined with specialized training and supervision, to effectively provide non-clinical recovery support to individuals seeking recovery.

- The Change Program-Interactive Journaling is an evidence-based practice for motivating and guiding individuals toward positive life change. It is goal directed, client-centered and helps participants modify behavior while progressing through the stages of change, precontemplation, contemplation, preparation action and maintenance. (Limited)

To provide more context on The Change Companies, they partner with many justice-involved agencies like the Indiana Dept. of Corrections and Allen County Jail since they are the publishers of risk-need-responsive Interactive Journals. The journals are meant to help facilitators guide their program participants toward positive behavior change (in this case: recidivism reduction and working toward sustainable employment) using evidence-based practices like Motivational Interviewing, CBT, and Expressive Writing.
