Mike Morris called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Review of minutes/claims.

Auditor Larry Hutchings presented the minutes from the June 9th, 2026 Commissioners' Meeting. Chris Switzer made a motion to approve the June 9th, 2026 Commissioners' Meeting minutes as presented. Mark Clinkenbeard was absent that meeting. Mike Morris seconded the motion. With a voice vote of 2-0 the motion passed.

Auditor Larry Hutchings presented the minutes from the June 16th, 2026 Commissioners' Meeting. Chris Switzer made a motion to approve the June 16th, 2026 Commissioners' Meeting minutes as presented. Mark Clinkenbeard seconded the motion. With a voice vote of 3-0 the motion passed.

The claims docket dated June 12th, 2026 through June 18th, 2026 in the amount of \$92,937,545.04 was presented to the Board. Mark Clinkenbeard made a motion to approve the claims docket dated June 12th, 2026 through June 18th, 2026 in the amount of \$92,937,545.04. Chris Switzer seconded the motion. The motion passed with a 3-0 vocal vote.

Larry then presented the payroll docket dated June 12th, 2026 through June 18th, 2026 in the amount of \$1,671,739.28 was then presented to the Board. Mark Clinkenbeard made a motion to approve the claim docket dated June 12th, 2026 through June 18th, 2026 in the amount of \$1,671,739.28. Chris Switzer seconded the motion. The motion passed with a 3-0 vocal vote.

Russelectric Contract

Ricky Hammond stated this was a renewal contract with Russelectric for equipment down at the jail. It's the equipment that transfers the power from the generator to the building when we lose power. If they complete all the work during normal hours its \$15,342.00 and if it goes into overtime hours with normal hours, it will be \$18,117.00. The contract lists all the preventive maintenance services. Mark Clinkenbeard asked if there was a break down or if this was normal preventive maintenance they are doing. Ricky said just normal preventive maintenance. Chris Switzer made a motion to approve the Russelectric contract. Mark Clinkenbeard seconded the motion. The motion passed with a 3-0 vocal vote.

12 Points Initiative Grant

Kristy Jerrell and Mike Pringle, Board Present of the 12 Points Initiative, were present. Kristy is asking the Commissioners if they would like to be a lead applicant for their project. The 12 Points Initiative would like to apply to IOCRA (Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs) grant which is now \$750,000. This is federal grant dollars coming from Housing and Urban Development. In order to apply to the federal grant program through the State of Indiana, the lead applicant must be a city, town, or county. 12 Points Revitalization Initiative would be the sub recipient. They would apply to round one in April or May 2027. There would be an A-133 Audit after the grant is completed and closed out. 12 Points Revitalization Initiative is wanting to make improvements to the interior on Harmony Hall. They have received several grants for the exterior and moving forward with. Mark Clinkenbeard asked if there was any matching. Kristy said yes, there is a required 10% match. They are raising money right now. Chris Switzer asked if there was a reason they are reaching out to county before the city. Kristy said through the IOCRA grant program, they do not recognize the city because they are considered an entitlement community. Larry Hutchings said he would like to review the paperwork and revisit next week. To be the lead applicant you have to meet by the national objectives, meaning they look at your census data of the whole county. You have to be at least 51% or higher, low to moderate income, and we are not. They have to do a full county income survey, which they have done before and we qualified. Chris Switzer made a motion to table the 12 Points Initiative grant until next week. Mark Clinkenbeard seconded the motion. The motion passed with a 3-0 vocal vote.

There were none.

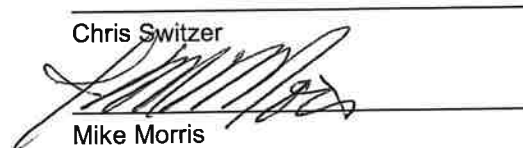
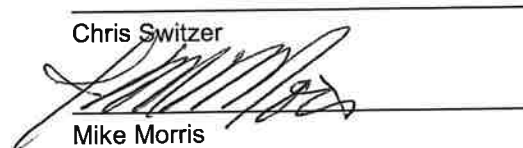
Comments or other business from Commissioners or other Elected Officials.
